Major Healthy Ageing Study Gets Underway in France As Senior Citizens Asked to Volunteer for Clinical Study

A €7m EC-funded project investigating mental health and well-being in later life is getting underway in Caen, France, with a series of public meetings.

The Silver Santé Study, which is a five-year research project, involves experts across Europe and is investigating mental health and well-being in the ageing population, with a particular focus on Alzheimer's disease and its mechanisms.

The global population is ageing, with the number of people over 60 expected to more than double during the first half of this century - reaching two billion by 2050 - and older persons predicted to exceed the number of children worldwide for the first time in 2047¹.

As human beings are living longer, ensuring good mental as well as physical health into later years is becoming ever more important. Identifying the determinants of a healthy old age will help safeguard quality of life and reduce the cost/care burden on health services of age-associated diseases.

"It's great to see the project progressing," says Gaël Chételat, co-ordinator of the Silver Santé Study. "We're now in the process of recruiting volunteers aged 65+ for our clinical study in Caen, France, and we're holding a series of public meetings this autumn so they can find out more about the Study and take part in pre-screening before the clinical trials begin in December 2016."

By carrying out clinical studies on volunteers aged 65+ presenting with varying health profiles, the research will measure the effectiveness of a variety of interventions, and so contribute to wider health policy discussions and forward-planning around the challenge of caring for our ageing global population, now and in the future.

The Study will run from 2016 to 2020 involving research partners in France, the UK, Spain, Belgium, Switzerland and Germany. It is being co-ordinated from Inserm (Institut national de la recherche sur la santé et la recherche médicale) based in Caen, Normandy - a region which has experienced one of

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the most rapid increases in the ageing population across the whole of France (a 40% rise in 20 years). Results will be measured through a combination of approaches including self-reporting, behavioural measures, neuroimaging scans, sleep measures and blood biomarkers.

A further clinical study will be carried out over four countries – France, the UK, Germany and Spain. Preparations for the study, which is coordinated by Natalie Marchant at University College London (UCL), are well underway and the research team is now applying for ethical approval from each participating country with a view to potential volunteers being recruited in each country early next year.
